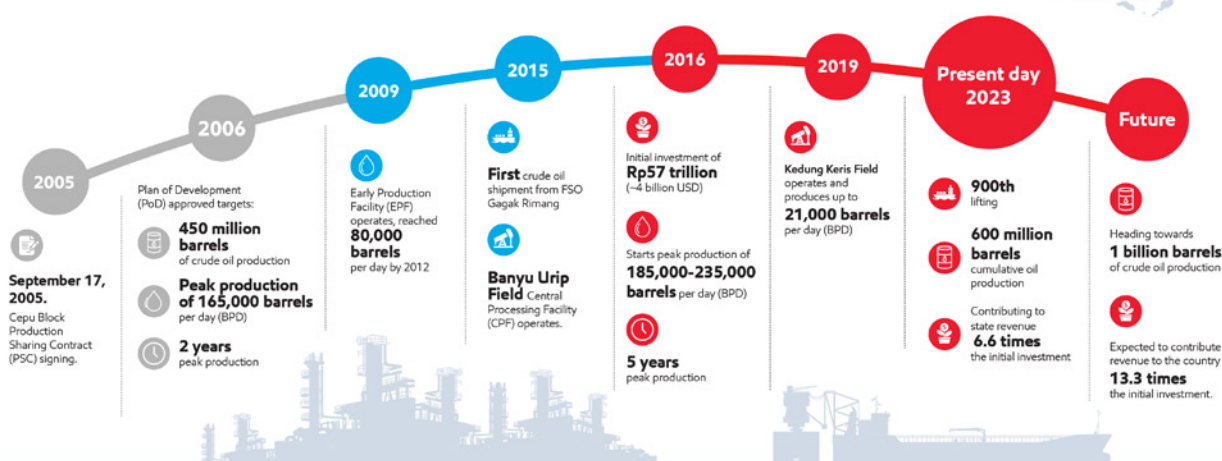

"Jagong Tani", where farmers share experiences



Farmers receive guidance on agriculture and safety along the pipelines of Banyu Urip Oil Field from agricultural supervisors and community-based pipeline surveillance program facilitators.

Farmers cultivating land along the pipelines of Banyu Urip and Kedung Keris Fields participate in the "Jagong Tani" Program. They come together to discuss agriculture and safety along the pipelines, recognized as vital national assets.

Masrukin, 45 years old, never misses a Jagong Tani session. As a resident of Wadang Village, Ngasem Subdistrict, Bojonegoro Regency, he finds it easier to solve various agricultural issues after regularly attending Jagong Tani. "My recent harvest has significantly improved and become more profitable," he said when interviewed at the end of July. Every month, Masrukin and 15 other farmers gather. They receive insights from agriculture experts brought in by the Inspektra Team. As part of the Community-Based Pipeline Surveillance Program, Inspektra organizes Jagong Tani.

As they acquire agricultural knowledge, the community also learns about safety aspects along the pipelines of Banyu Urip and Kedung Keris Oil Fields. Nearly 1,500 farmers from 56 villages in Bojonegoro and Tuban Regencies have participated in Jagong Tani. Since 2020, Jagong Tani has been beneficial for farmers and effective in ensuring safety around these vital national oil pipeline assets. ▀

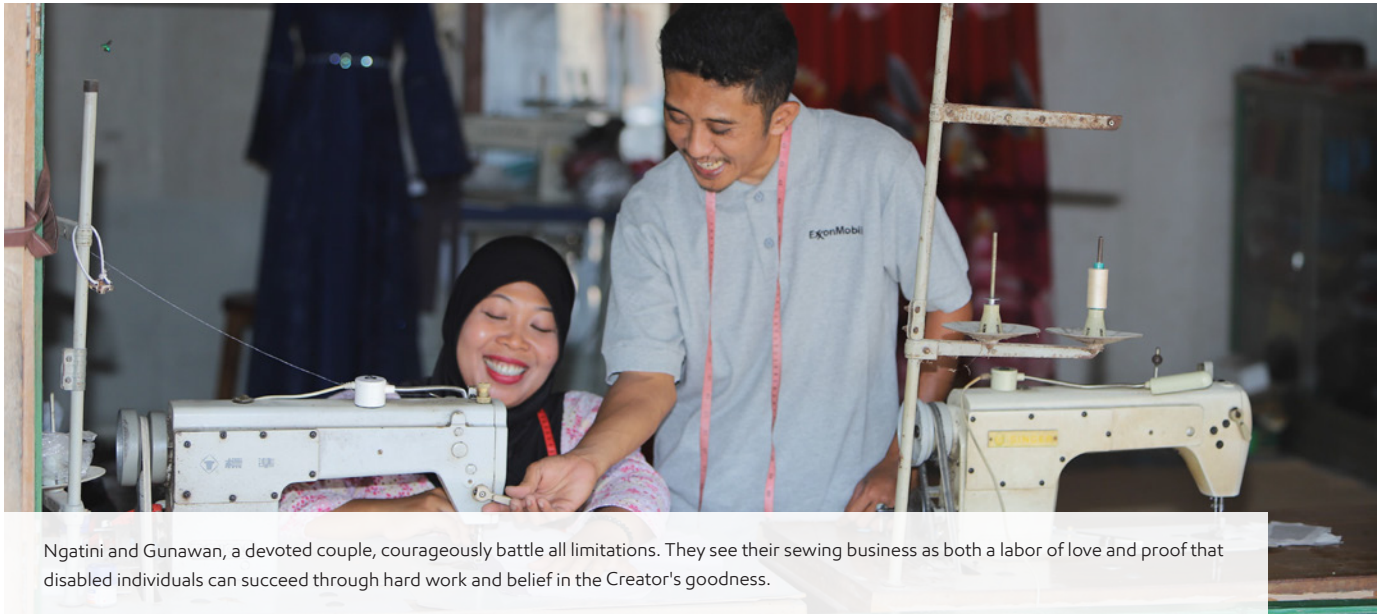

While participating in economic development programs for people with disabilities by ExxonMobil Cepu Limited (EMCL), Ngatigun displayed great enthusiasm. They diligently took part in every activity, including the establishment of the Shared House for People with Disabilities (RBD) in Bojonegoro.

Now, they have ventured into sewing. Their expertise in sewing has gained trust from various government agencies, companies, schools, and the local community. They handle orders efficiently and satisfactorily, earning them regular customers. •

Confidently, Ngatini and Gunawan attend various events in many regions, both within the Regency and in East Java Province.

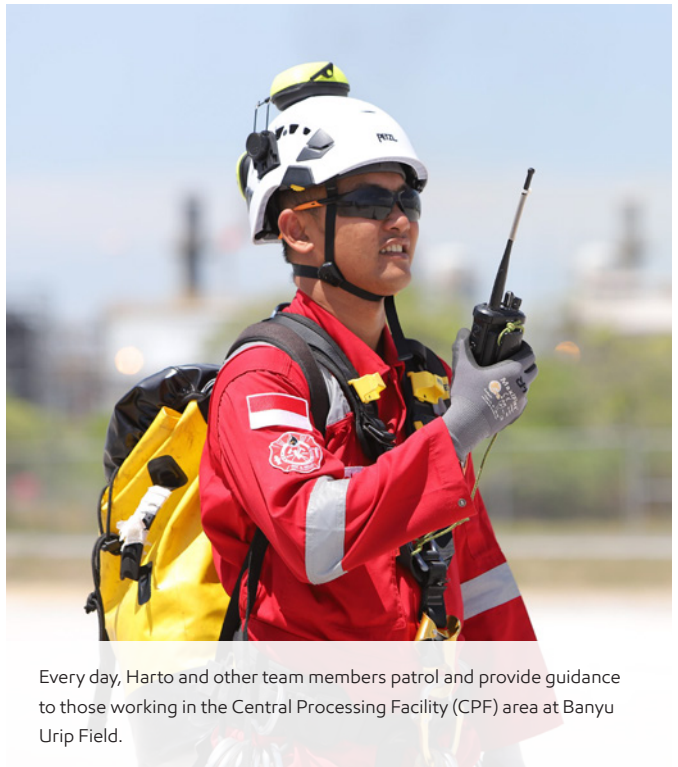

From there, he diligently learned various aspects of rescue operations. Now, he has become an essential member of the rescue team, equipped with national and international certifications in various skills. •

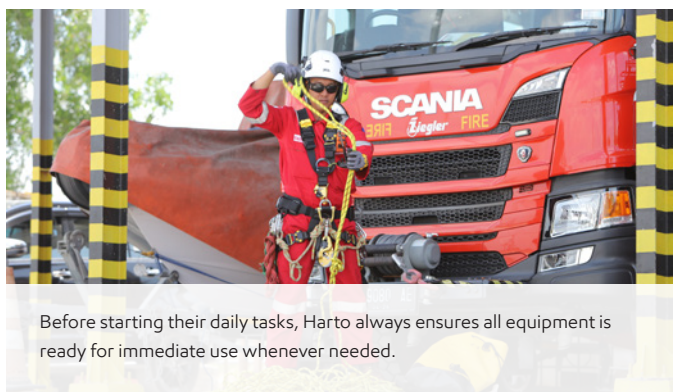
